
#### Social Action Committee is Back at the Movies

## "John Brown's Body" Kicks Off New Series on Restorative Justice

Saturday, January 17 – 7:00 PM

Following a one-year hiatus, the Social Action Committee is resurrecting its very successful movie series on human rights and social justice with a powerhouse: "John Brown's Body at San Quentin Prison," January 17, in the Sanctuary.

Filmmaker Joe De Francesco will introduce his film, which was 10 years in the making. It began with a stage performance of Stephen Vincent Benet's epic poem "John Brown's Body" that prisoners at San



Quentin presented in 2002. The rehearsal period lasted almost three years as 35 inmates passed through the drama workshop. Although it was widely assumed that the story of slavery and freedom would be inflammatory in a prison setting, the experience in fact became transformative for many prisoners and the filmmaker during the long process that led to an award-winning film.

"We are delighted to welcome the filmmaker, who hopes to bring a couple of the prisoneractors to Sonoma County," said Bruce Berkowitz, new chair of the SAC Film Committee. When the film opened last year, San Francisco Chronicle Film Critic Mick LaSalle called it "one of the film high points of 2013." For more information, go to www.JBBatSQP.com.

"Our eight-person committee selected restorative justice as our theme for the three-film series," Bruce said. "Madeleine Rose will be working on our second film, built around restorative justice in the schools. In the third, former SAC film chair Susan Daniel will be looking at restorative justice on the international level."

Other dates scheduled for the film series are February 21 and March 21. All three films will be shown on Saturday evenings at 7 PM. Most will be followed by a panel discussion. Refreshments will be served.

# Rabbi George Participates in the Fall WOLM Lecture Series at the Santa Rosa Junior College

"A River Runs Through It" has a rather startling beginning, at least for the uninitiated: "In our family, there was no clear line between religion and fly fishing." Think about it. What do religion and fly fishing have in common? After all, the goal of fly fishing is to pierce the mouth of a fish by fooling it into thinking that the menacing thing in the water is actually something it likes to eat. Once this cruel charade is over and you have the fish "on," you then proceed to haul it through the water – the more it struggles the better! - lift it into the air, look at it in various poses for the camera while it gasps for breath and then dispose of it in various cruel ways, depending on your goal and its size. Now, unless you are contemplating the Inquisition, this does not seem like religion to me! And, I will confess, as a religious person, I have at times struggled with this question. In fact, I have a colleague who solved the problem by declaring that "fish don't have souls." She hasn't caught a fish since. So, how are religion and fly fishing connected?

According to Webster, a religion is "the belief in a god or in a group of gods: an organized system of beliefs, ceremonies, and rules used to worship a god or a group



of gods. . . ." I have known more than one fly fisherperson whose reverence for trout bordered on "religious," and there are many rituals experienced in a day on the water - arranging your flies, approaching a stretch of water, testing your "rig," warm-up casts – yet this definition still seems lacking, at least for our purposes. I'd like to share a more personal perspective on this novella, a gem of a story; I've been drawn to it since I first read it some 30 years ago. I bring to it my experience as a son, a father, a brother, a fly fisherman, and a religious person, all roles that I share with Norman Maclean, all themes found in the book. from the love of the river to the love of family and to the sense of great loss that permeates the whole . . .

Three children and many lifecycle events later, the Bornstein's feeling of belonging is as strong as ever. Their commitment and desire to give back to the congregation led Dan to serve two terms as president, and Linda has been an active participant in a wide variety of Synagogue activities. Today they note that while their busy schedules often mean they cannot see the many friends they have made during these years as frequently as they would like, there is a special joy in seeing and catching up with them at High Holy Days services.

Inspired by the gifts of Robert and Claire Harris and Stuart Sobelman, who once welcomed them into the Shomrei Torah community, the Bornsteins knew they would want to name the Synagogue a beneficiary in their wills. Their gift is not directed to any particular program or purpose, but can be used where most needed at the time. Says Linda, "the crux of our giving is to

## Toy and Clothing/Bedding Drive

We are continuing our collections of toys for the Posada and warm items for the clothing drive. Labeled bins are in CST's front entry.

As a reminder, the toy drive's purpose is to contribute gifts for the Roseland area family Posada, an annual event sponsored by Comite Vidas (previously known as the Committee for Immigrant Rights), and co-sponsored by Shomrei Torah and other faith-based and community organizations. The Posada will be held on December 20 and all are welcome to volunteer or just observe. The warm clothing and bedding are for our neighbors and Elisha's Pantry recipients. This year we are expanding our distribution to the county homeless shelter as well. During last year's extreme cold temperatures, the need was critical for coats and bedding for people living on the streets or in inadequate shelters. The items needed this year are gloves, scarves, hats, clean socks, rain gear, warm coats, heavy sweaters, warm shoes and boots, thermal wear, and warm sweatshirts and pants. And we never have enough warm blankets and sleeping bags! Large, extra-large, and children's sizes are especially needed. Please be sure that all items are in good condition – gently used with no stains or holes. We will not be collecting other types of clothing this year, so please donate t-shirts, blouses, pants, dresses, and other lightweight items as well as sheets and pillow cases to other community charities.

Ask your friends and neighbors to donate both toys and winter clothing as well! Volunteers will be needed for sorting and distribution in December. Children are welcome to help out. Contact the CST office for more information.



## Holiday Mitzvah – Domestic Violence Shelter Fund

Domestic violence affects our entire community. One out of four families are struggling with some form of abuse played out behind closed doors. Mostly we never know about it. The YWCA defines domestic violence as threatening behavior that seeks to control and exercise power over another person.

In recent months, the Social Action Committee of Shomrei Torah has sponsored several activities related to this serious issue. We presented the movie, "Crime After Crime," and brought author Joshua Safran and a panel of guests to read and discuss the nature and prevalence of domestic violence throughout our community and the nation.

Members of our Social Action Committee recently visited the YWCA offices; the Safe House, a three-story residence for women and their children; and the school, a safe environment where children receive counseling. We met with YWCA staff to determine their current needs, particularly those related to the Safe House.

The Safe House's needs are many, and include remodeling, flooring, painting, updating appliances, furnishings, windows, and more. The staff is seeking to enlist community help to upgrade the quality of the environment that allows women and their children, who have braved leaving their abusers, to feel at home during their transitional time.

Heading the list of needs are two sets of new, heavy-duty washer/dryers for the laundry room. Our Social Action Committee has decided to provide them. A donation of Chai, \$18 per person, will help us reach our goal of \$4,000, the cost of the machines. Aside from the suggested donation, any amount will be gratefully accepted.

Please make your Chai check out to the CST Social Action Committee and note that it is intended for the YWCA Safe House. Thank you so much!!!
