Rabbi's Tisch Sylvia Boorstein

"It's as Good as Fixed—Forgiveness, the Radical Practice of Liberation"

Sylvia Boorstein is a meditation teacher, a psychotherapist and a storyteller.



A person with a Jewish background who practices forms of Buddhist meditation and spirituality is considered a Jewish Buddhist. A large demographic of Jewish Buddhists maintain religious practices and beliefs in Judaism coupled with Buddhist practices and beliefs. This might describe Sylvia Boorstein.

Sylvia Boorstein is a founding teacher of Spirit Rock Meditation Center and began teaching Mindfulness Meditation in 1985. She is a psychotherapist, a wife, a mother and a grandmother who is particularly interested in seeing daily life as practice. A central figure in the Jewish project of integrating mindfulness practices into Jewish life, she is renowned in both the Buddhist and the Jewish communities.

CST in the Community

Thanks to the dedicated CST members who marched with Rabbi George and the North Bay Organizing Project to show we care about our local, affordable-housing crisis. Speaking as one of the lead clergy, Rabbi George offered a compelling perspective as the marchers gathered:

"There is something wrong with a community that will take your labor but not your rent, that needs you to provide the services to run the community, but won't provide you the means to live in that community. There is something wrong here; that's why we are marching, letting our elected officials know that we will not stand idly by.... A fundamental principle of Judaism, my religion, is that all people – all people – are created in the image of God and that means that all people deserve to be treated with dignity. There is no dignity without a roof over your head. Marching to me is praying with your feet, and my prayer today is for the dignity of all people, that everyone should have a roof over their head, that if you work here you ought to be able to afford to live here. I'm praying with my feet today and with each step I am saying, 'no to rent exploitation and yes to rent stabilization!' I'm praying with my feet today and with each step I am saying, 'no to the indignity of homelessness and yes to the worth of every human being, created in God's image, worthy of the dignity of affordable housing, the ability to live where you work, to contribute and also benefit from the society in which you live." "

Since the implementation of our Waste Management Program two years ago,

there has been some confusion about which waste bin to use and when.

Picture this: You are standing in front of the waste management station located in the CST sanctuary. You have a wine stained paper cup in your hand, a paper plate with some food stuck to it, compostable utensils and a used paper napkin. All you want to do is throw these things away. You are faced with three options: Compost, Recycling or Landfill. Don't fret! Take your best guess and give your items a toss. The good news is that all Recycling and Compost bins get resorted before they arrive at their final destination. What we want to focus on at CST is the trash that is placed in the Landfill bin, because that is something we want to reduce.

CST's waste is handled differently than your waste at home. We are in a program that is made available to commercial entities such as restaurants. Because of this we are allowed to place all of our food related waste including meat and dairy, food-soiled paper products and compostable utensils into our Compost bins.

This reduces the amount of trash that ends up in our black bins, reducing the amount of waste that finds its way to the newly reopened Sonoma County landfill. Our county landfill is on the verge of being closed again because of overuse, so we want to do what we can to reduce what we send there. Rates are based on the amount of trash we produce (landfill), and since recycling and compost are picked up at no cost; this special waste program has saved CST money.



Compostable Items (Green Bin)

- All food including meat and cheese and other dairy
- Food-contaminated paper products (stocked in the pantry)
- Compostable utensils (stocked in the pantry)
- · Leaves and grass

Recyclable Items (Blue Bin)

- · Plastic cups including kiddush
- Metal cans and foil
- Glass bottles and jars including metal caps
- · Clean paper cups and plates
- · Clean paper and newspaper
- · Clean cardboard
- · Milk and drink cartons
- · Plastic bags stuffed inside of a clear bag

Trash (Black Bin)

Includes items that don't recycle or compost

- Rubber gloves and bands
- Bottle caps
- Art projects with glue
- · Styrofoam products
- Name tags
- Candles
- Straws
- Plastic wrap
- Stiff plastic bags.

A future topic on waste might include controversies regarding the Sonoma County landfill, and the shaky market for recyclables. But enough for now.

- To support the principles of equality, freedom and shalom among all peoples.
